

REVIVALS HELP BREAK UP THE WINTER DOLDRUMS



Philadelphia's African American Catholic community were revived recently, as hundreds gathered for two faith-based cultural events.

Participants traveled from across the Delaware Valley for the first Sister Thea Bowman Conference held at St. Therese of the Holy Child Jesus Catholic Church on March 4 – 5, 2016. It came on the heels of the two-day Gospel Revival featuring the Revs. Anthony Bozeman and Rayford Emmons at the Our Lady of Hope Catholic Church, 5200 N. Broad Street.

Stacy Williams, an organizer of the Bowman Conference, said there were already plans for another conference in 2018, a year after the National Black Catholic Congress meets in Orlando. Planners hope waiting a year will help the local conference draw a national audience. "We were so excited to have Father R. Tony Ricard from the Institute for Black Catholic Studies in New Orleans, LA speak to us," Williams said. "It just added to the conference that went really well. One lady told me that she learned so much about Sister Thea Bowman, about what it means to be Black and Catholic, and what her place is in the church."

The conference's theme was "A Celebration of Her Life, A Strengthening of Our Gifts." Among the highlights was when Bernadette Tanksley did an impersonation of Sister Thea Bowman.

It was helpful to have youth on the planning committee as there were workshops geared toward them. About half of those in attendance were youths and young adults.

REFLECTION: MAN-UP PHILLY MEN'S SPIRITUALITY **CONFERENCE - 3.12.16**

There is great need for a forum to support and promote the spirituality of men. At our Sunday masses, there is generally a 2 or 3 to 1 ratio of women to men in attendance. We can probably attribute poor church attendance in general to the many other choices that people can

make on Sunday's. These choices may range from

sales at shopping malls to sporting events. We forget that salvation is free to choose and "The Resurrection" is an event whose outcome has no equal! The competing opportunities are supplemented by a belief in the minority community as to what defines masculinity. We are well aware of the belief that education is seen as not cool. Well, I believe that men may view the passivity of religion as weak and therefore not a masculine endeavor.
