

"A Dream in Black and White: Growing in Understanding as Catholics" drew a diverse, standing-room-only crowd to the St. Philip Neri Catholic Church in Lafayette Hill on Monday evening to honor the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. It was the 34th annual Archdiocese gathering to the civil rights icon on his birthday, and marked the first time the event was held in a predominantly white Catholic suburban congregation.

About half the audience were African Americans as at least three busloads of parishioners came from churches such as St. Raymond of Penafort in Mount Airy, St. Athanasius Catholic community in West Oak Lane and St. Barbara Church in West Philadelphia. On the program was Deacon Bill Bradley, Director of the Office for Black Catholics, along with African-American priests, the Rev. Rayford Emmons and Rev. Stephen Thorne.



Jamey F. Moses, first-year Seminarian

The remarks that drew the loudest standing ovation were those of Jamey Francis Moses, a first-year seminarian at the St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Wynnewood and a parishioner at the St. Martin de Porres Church in North Philadelphia. It was his experiences on the Main Line campus that was at the heart of his testimony. "I was walking on the grounds reflecting and praying," Moses said. "The campus guard came in detail and physically restrained me before I realized what happened. I was taking a little time with Jesus."

Moses explained that someone reported seeing "a suspicious Black man on campus." The person who called security "reported feeling uncomfortable when a Black man walked by," he said, leading him to ask whether Black lives mattered. **Read more**

St. Thomas Aguinas Church - Annual Retreat

Daria Ward, President, and Co-founder of "CBC" (Concerned Black Catholics) of Saint Thomas Aquinas Church in South Philadelphia, organized their Annual Retreat on October 22, 2016, at the National Shrine of Saint Rita of Cascia located at 1166 S. Broad Street in South Philadelphia, all parishioners were able to attend. Father Joe Genito was the facilitator for the retreat. The topic at this year's annual retreat was "Faith and Acceptance" with much reference to Saint Rita's life and about the understanding of Reconciliation and Peacemaking. While lunch was being provided, the group could have a breakout discussion to examine their thoughts, opinions, ideas, and give reflection about the topic.

The retreat included a tour of the church/shrine and confession was offered, followed by Mass. *In 2017, Daria stated that she hopes to have more people attend the retreat and her goal for CBC, is for all Black Catholics, to come together throughout the Philadelphia parishes for fellowship.* Read more
